Legislation Committee Report

Midwest Federation Newsletter, December, 1987

(This report abbreviated by Marge Callins)

The Committee on Guidelines for Paleontelogical Collecting created by the National Academy of Science met early in August to approve their final recommendations to the BLM, U.S. Farest Service and Congress, following a three year indepth study. Their study covered the viewpoints of professionals, commercial and hebby collectors...(emong others). Advice was sought in Great British, Canada and Germany on their procedures.

After much soul-searching, the committee adopted a statement of principle as a basis of its datailed recommendations which is: the science of paleontology is best served by unimpeded access to fessils and fessil-bearing rocks in the field. (Based on this) the Committee fermulated 10 recommendations which include the need for a uniform policy for state and federal agencies, permits for quarries and commercial collectors only, depositing fessils of scientific significance in institutions for research and education and the need for ...programs to inform... of the research needs of professional paleontologists.

The Cranston 5-7 Bill proposes to remove 7.5 million series of BLM land in Colifornia and place it into national park and milderness. This designation effectively eliminates multiple upon on vest areas of the California desert. Currently under BLM guidelines, reckhounding is acceptable in designated wilderness areas and long as it does not degrade the wilderness values. The National Park Service, in contrast, does not allow rockhounding whatsoever in wilderness areas and Parks....The areas designated in Cranston S-7 Bill are among the most highly mineralized areas in the world.....Shirley Lesson, CFMS (Calif. Eqd.) President urgss all rockhounds to write to their congressmen and senators since they will vote on the bill and determine the fate of all rockhound collecting in these designated areas.
