

EDUCATION AND COMMUNITY SERVICE -- FLORENCE HILL

The mineral for December study will be corundum, an aluminum oxide. David Piotrowski will give the talk. Specimens of corundum will make a very pretty showing for our Christmas meeting, so bring or wear yours!

The question was raised when David discussed pyrite and marcasite of how to preserve the latter. Here are some suggestions from an exchange bulletin. Try them out:

Mix one heaping tablespoon of baking soda in one quart of water. Let it effervesce and wash marcasite in it. Rinse well in clear water and dry. Then dip marcasite in medium weight mineral oil and drain.

Check the boxes in which marcasite specimens are stored, as they form sulphuric acid and can eat through the containers. Have also heard that they should not be stored on white paper due to agents used in making the paper.
